

Temples of Bengal

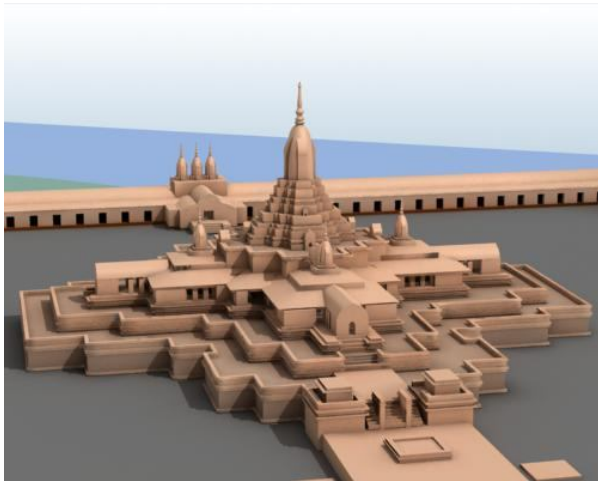
